Fundraisers/Events

We have many events scheduled for this year. In order for them to be as successful as possible, we need everyone to pitch in!! We understand all events may not be of interest to everyone. If you find one or two to volunteer your time and ideas, that would be great!! Some of our events may not be as well-known as others so below is a brief description of some the lesser known events.

- ◆ Dog Costume Contest- In conjunction with the Adult Halloween Party held downtown, Anderson Humane sponsors a dog costume contest featuring pets and their owners. 2019 was the first year for this event. We had many happy participants!!
- ◆ Angel Paws – this event involves placing Christmas trees in our local veterinarian's offices and other local businesses agreeing to participate. The trees are decorated with ornaments with different needs at the Adoption Center.
- ◆ Dogs and Chips- this is a new venture beginning in 2020 in partnership with Animal Control. This event will provide dog owners the opportunity to chip their pet and purchase necessary license required by local government.
- ◆ Paws, Purrs and Putts Golf Scramble- A golf scramble held at Wild Turkey Trace Golf Course.
- ◆ Spaggetti Dinner – a spaghetti dinner held in partnership with the Lawrenceburg United Methodist Church mission team to support the Spay/Neuter fund.

These events are held along with the Humane Society's well established events: Garden Party, 127 Yard Sale, Rummage Sale, Rabies Clinic, and Christmas Parade.

In addition to the events/fundraisers mentioned, we also need volunteers for supply drives and adoption events held throughout the year. We want as many members as possible to participate in the events of interest to them and help support the animals!!!

Short and Long Range Goals

In the January meeting, the board discussed short and long range goals for the Anderson Humane Society. A long range goal involved exploring the sustainability and feasibility of building/relocating the Adoption Center. A short term goal was seeking and encouraging recurring donations.
